EMOTIONAL SUPPORT

Isaac's Clubhouse

A safe place for teens on the autism spectrum to congregate, explore interests and make connections with others in their community. Clubhouse hosts a summer camp, too.

TREK (Teachable Moments • Reverse Inclusion • Education • Kinship)

TREK partners youth impacted by autism with peer-mentors and executive functioning coaches, to learn the skills needed to confidently access their community and demonstrate independence while navigating activities of daily living. For instance, how to ride the bus, pay bills or learn to grocery shop.

Discovery Saturdays

A free, monthly themed program for all abilities youth birth to 12.

Studio Events

Monthly fun activities and mini hands-on crafting events for special needs youth and Spokane community members to practice reverse inclusion.

Parent Support Groups

Monthly Coffee Chats, Parents' Mix & Mingle and inclusive play dates at Riverfront Park give parents the opportunity to get out, unwind, and connect with other parents of children touched by special needs.

Sibling Spotlight

Monthly meet ups designed specifically for neuro-typical youth who have a sibling touched by autism. It is a chance for these kids to connect with peers who can relate to their circumstances.

Autism Friendly Family Events

Trick-or-Treat Practice Party, Autism Acceptance Month Celebrations, Sensory Supportive Easter Egg Hunt, Taste of Gingerbread Holiday event and so much more!

System where guardians can register a home address caution note with local first responders in advance of a 911 emergency.

A simulated studio-style living space is used as a classroom where individuals with special needs learn developmentally appropriate interactions and critical life-saving fire safety skills with area first responders.
